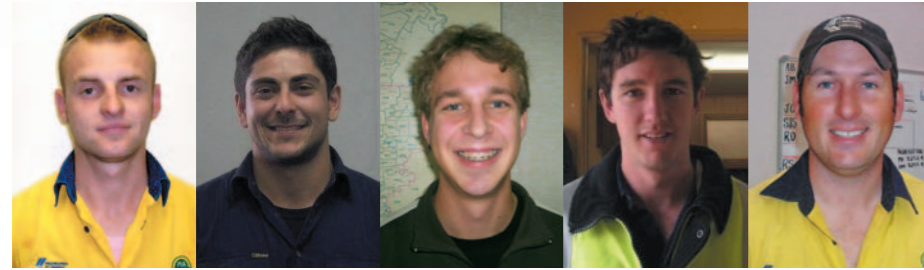

All completed their Apprenticeships in March, April or May 2011 and have transitioned to tradesmen with Hindmarsh Plumbing. Well done guys!

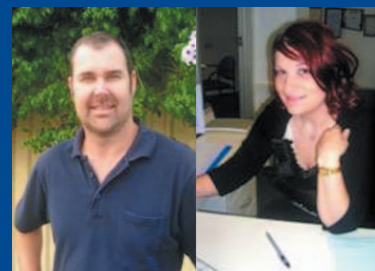

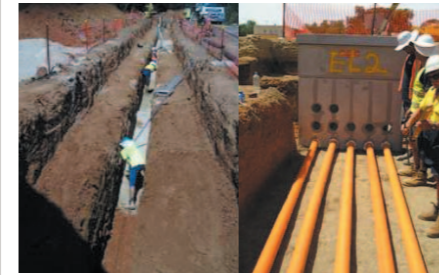

Project Profile: Secure Youth Training Centre

The new Youth Training Centre will be a 60 bed facility located on 7.7 hectares out at Cavan. The facility will comprise of 5 accommodation blocks and an education facility.

The centre will aim to provide children and young people the opportunity to build their education, vocational skills and address the issues that brought them into contact with the criminal justice system. This new facility will replace the current centre at Magill.

Hindmarsh Plumbing was contracted by Hansen Yuncken in late December of 2010 and work commenced on site on the 17th of January 2011 undertaking the Early Works Hydraulic Contract. The site peaked at 35 staff in teams of 3, which is headed up by Site Managers Chris Klopff, Adolf Edlinger and Craig Chenoweth.

An estimated 12,000 hrs of work have been put in by the site team to date. Hindmarsh Plumbing's scope of works includes 2.3km of sewer drainage, 1.4km of storm water drainage, and 10km of electrical conduit. The team will also be carrying out under floor drainage to 11 buildings, installing 128 concrete pits for electrical,

mechanical, water and storm water services as well as mechanical heating and chilled pipe work. The team is also busy installing 1.5kms of Fire Hydrant services including tanks and a fire pump room. This also includes spoil removal exceeding 13,000 tonnes.

Matt McGregor the onsite HPS Safety Representative was happy to report, that to date there has been no Lost Time Injuries (LTI's), Medical Treated Injuries (MTI's) or First Aid treatment required (FA's). Rob Pavan agreed this was an excellent outcome so far.

The team has also faced a variety of challenges from dealing with the complexity of the services, the large number of men required on site and the uncontrollable changes in weather. This meant dealing with pouring rain and muddy conditions one week, to hot, dry and dusty the next. Site Manger Adolf Edlinger said; "the site team have been working very hard and coping very well with the pressure.

They are all doing a good job and I am proud of them." Chris Klopff added; "They are all putting in a great effort and excelling with their work. They're a team of Mustangs." Rob (acting Project Manager) added, "Mark Kempster and his team worked countless hours to coordinate the services and delivered a remarkable design. A fantastic job by all."

The completion of the Early Works Hydraulic Contract is due in June 2011 with an estimated value of 2.6 million dollars. Hindmarsh Plumbing is currently in negotiations to gain the Main Works Contract which follows on from the early works with completion of the overall project due March 2012.

Staff Profile: Gary Reynolds

(Project Manager Southern Office)

What was your first ever job?

I started a plumbing apprenticeship in my Dad's plumbing business when I was 15 years old. School didn't agree with me and I haven't looked back since!

What is your favourite movie?

Any early films with Rowan Atkinson in it – and the Blackadder Series on TV in particular.

What is your favourite food?

Chinese food.

What are your hobbies?

Early on, when I was young I started racing dirt bikes in endurance events, which was fun. Then I bought a 23ft trailer sailing boat and got into sailing. From there I got into airplanes – I got my pilots licence and started an aircraft engineering apprenticeship which helped when I started restoring old planes with a mate. I like the diversity of challenges that I am presented with each day – no two days are the same and it keeps you on your toes and your brain working. You never quite know what you could be doing from day to day.

What are the challenges of your role?

Probably reacting to the diversity of those challenges – you have to be flexible and able to react to any given situation that you may be faced with, whether that's due to changing client requirements, reacting to emergency work or business requirements.

Warm Water Treatment Team

In July 2009, the Service Division in conjunction with the Department of Health, held two information sessions to provide an overview of Regulatory changes for maintaining high risk manufactured water systems and compliance of, to existing and potential clients.



These sessions were positively received and from that Hindmarsh Plumbing and its Water Treatment team have now become the "go-to" people when it comes to implementing, maintaining and treating warm and cold water systems for our clients.

Ross Jones, Operations Manager for the Service Division has spent many hours researching the most effective way of disinfecting warm and cold water systems minimising the growth of Legionella and developing procedures that are thorough, safe and highly effective.

This process includes being proactive in the community and visiting clients to assess their needs, developing treatment programs tailored to their site requirements. As a result the Water Treatment team lead on the ground by Matt Bartlett have developed a reputation within the industry as leaders in this field and to date has three full time plumbers allocated to the team. The client base now includes Aged Care and High Care hospital facilities in the metropolitan areas.

These include Masonic Homes, Anglicare, Southern Cross Care, Uniting Care Wesley Aged Care Facilities as well as country locations such as Penola Hospital and Boandik Lodge Aged Care in Mount Gambier.

The challenges for the Water Treatment team include continuing to research and implement better systems and processes, build relationships with their existing and potential new clients and to achieve a water quality and control standard acceptable to all regulatory bodies, such as the Department of Health under the Guidelines for the Control of Legionella, World Health Authorities and The Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

Whilst the Water Treatment team carries out programmed maintenance of systems, the team must take immediate action in the event of an infected water supply with site attendance within one hour from an infection notification 24 hours per day to ensure the system is decontaminated and the risk of all infection is eliminated to residence and staff within the site.

In all emergency situations the water treatment team have been highly successful and look forward to projected growth within the water treatment industry.

Ronald McDonald House

The Ronald McDonald House (RMH) charity is dedicated to assisting families with seriously ill children. The first house established in January 2000 and located a short distance from the Women's and Children's Hospital provides accommodation and support for up to 10 families at a time.

Over the past 11 years the house has since provided a home away from home for nearly 1200 families.

Looking towards the future, the Management at RMH decided to establish a secondary house to

cater for additional families and build added suitable housing for those requiring accommodation for longer than 3 months.

Since July 2010, Site Manager, Matt McGregor and an apprentice have been on-site full-time installing the inground services, suspended drainage, and reticulated pipework and during the final stage, the fitting of sanitary fixtures/tapware.

Ken Hannah says the project has provided a strong sense of giving back to the community. Over 100 suppliers have since

volunteered time or resources to the valuable project. The new development, located at 270 Melbourne Street, North Adelaide is situated directly opposite the current house and will be double its capacity.
